## IMPAACT SPECIMEN SHIPPING DIRECTIVE UPDATE

March, 2012

The following protocols are currently approved for specimen shipments to the Repository at Biomedical Research Institute (BRI). Refer to the protocol document and/or Lab Processing Chart (LPC) for the type of specimens to be sent. Do not send specimens that will be tested within 6 months of collection.

## **REMINDERS:**

- --Specimens from 219/219C and P1025 remain the highest priority and the sites/laboratories should concentrate on getting these specimens to the repository first. Once a site/laboratory has shipped all 219/219C and P1025 samples it should resume shipment of specimens from the remaining **21** high priority protocols: 076, 152, 300, 316, 338, 345, 351, 356, 377, 381, 382, 390, P1020A, P1034, P1045, P1053, **P1058, P1058a, P1060, P1078 and P1083.**
- --The IMPAACT Laboratory Steering Committee (ILSC) will allow each NIAID site/laboratory to ship off-schedule until all specimens are at BRI. This means every site/laboratory can ship Monday-Wednesday (only) any or all weeks of each month.

--The specimens <u>must be QC'd</u> before sending them to BRI. BRI will not accept specimens with missing, illegible, or damaged labels. Specimen labels must have, at a minimum, the PID, study number, date, derivative. The information on the labels must match the Laboratory Data Management System (LDMS) entry for that specimen. Specimen boxes with >10% discrepancies will be returned to the site/lab.
